### "DUNGEONS & DRAGONS" by T.L. Lawrence

You have your longsword drawn, and as you turn the corner 30 lizard men are charging at you. What do you do?

This just might happen if you are playing D&D. as we Dungeons & Dragons players call it. D&D is a complex, if not fun game. You, the player, make up a character. The character, male or female, has different races to choose from: dware, elven, gnome, half-elven, halfing, half-orc, and last but not least, human.

The next thing is to "role-up" your strength, intelligence, wisdom, dexterity, constitution and charisma by rolling dice. Then you must choose your character stock from a list of classes and

sub-classes:

Cleric - uses magic Druid - subclass of cleric, uses magic

Fighter - uses weapons

Paladin - subclass of fighter, uses weapons Ranger - subclass of fighter, uses weapons

Magic User - uses magic Illusionist - subclass of Magic User, uses magic. Thief - uses weapons

Assassin - subclass of thief, uses weapons Monk - uses weapons and open hand combat

"DICE" - The dice you use in D&D aren't your usual 6 sided. When you buy the packet that con-tains the dice you might think you're seeing things. You not only get one 6 sided, but a 4 sided, an 8 sided, 12 sided, and a 20 sided, which doubles as a 10 sided.

Dice are commonly used for rolling damage on an opponent from a spell or weapon. They are also used to determine who draws their weapon or casts a spell first. This is called initiative.

"ALIGNMENT" - The alignment you choose might just be the most important thing you choose when you play D&D. You must choose between good and evil, law and chaos, or neutral.

Chaotic Evil - this alignment wants to kill and destroy.

Chaotic Good - this alignment wants to do good deeds.

Chaotic Neutral - this alignment can choose between Chaotic Evil and Chaotic Good.

Lawful Evil - this alignment is not as destructive as Chaotic Evil.

Lawful Good - this alignment does not do as many good deeds as Chaotic Good. Lawful Neutral - this alignment can choose

between Lawful Good and Lawful Evil. Neutral Evil - this alignment is compelled to

kill, but doesn't much. Neutral Good - this alignment wants to do good deeds, but seldom does.

True Neutral - this alignment can choose between Neutral Evil and Neutral Good.

All characters start out at first level, which is the least experienced. To move up levels you must gain magical weapons, or kill creatures which are probably guarding the magical item.

In the beginning it may be a little tough for the character to move up levels, for the beginner is offered only a limited number of gold pieces money. With the little that you attain in the beginning, you must buy weapons and armor that will help you stay alive long enough to win enough gold pieces to buy better armor and weapons. Different weapons do different damage, the more powerful the weapon, the more expensive

it is. This is just a taste of what D&D is really like - battling with monsters, building your castle, drafting an army, roaming strange worlds - there are close to 20 modules, or dungeons, to go through.
