## ATARI CARTRIDGE REVIEW: "VENTURE" & "PITFALL"

In Venture, you are a witty the adventurer, and you're off on a perilous journey for treasure. But be careful of the monsters!

Venture is the newest cartridge made by Colecovision for the Atari system. You start off as a dot on the screen. Also occupying the screen are 4 rooms and 6 hall monsters - you can't hurt the hall monsters - just try to stay out of their way.

When game play starts, you can move your dot into any of the 4 rooms. Once inside, you change from a dot to a smiling face. There are 3 monsters guarding a treasure. You must kill the monsters and get the treasure. But in order to get points for killing monsters, you must get the treasure, then fire away with your bow and arrow. If you stay in a room too long, a hall monster will come in. If you touch any of the monsters (dead or alive) you lose one of the 4 men you have.

There are 2 dungeons in Venture. See how far you can venture by getting Venture.

In Pitfall, you are Pitfall Harry, and you must run through the jungle getting treasure and avoiding crocodiles, snakes, scorpions, fires, tar pits, rolling logs and lakes. You start with 2000 points and you lose points by getting hit by logs or falling down holes. You can lose men by falling in tar pits, lakes, croc's mouths, or by touching a snake or scorpion.

The way to avoid snakes and scorpions is by jumping over them. And all the other stuff by vines that swing overhead.

As your timer counts from 20 minutes down, you must find as many treasure items as you can. Game ends when you run out of time or when you lose 3 men.

An excellent take-off on the movie Raiders of the Lost Ark, or Tarzan minus Bo Derek.

### G-93 AND THE CHUCKER

Have you ever wondered what went on at your local radio station? I did so that is why I went to WRGI, also known as G-93, and talked to The Chucker - he is the music director and has been working at G-93 for several years now. He went to Brown and Ft. Lauderdale Broadcasting School, both for one year.

I asked The Chucker why he wanted to be a D.J. He said "I liked what I heard." Also, his favorite recording group is Fleetwood Mac, and his favorite current song is "Gypsy" by Fleetwood Mac.

Since G-93 is the only local station with it's own countdown, I asked how he figured it out. He uses both "Billboard" and "Radio and Records" magazines.

The reason why G-93 has a 732 exchange phone number is because the telephone company had too many repairs to make when it was a 775 exchange number, and because late at night if someone missed a digit dialing, it would wake people up and they complained.  
If you haven't heard some of your newer favorite songs, it is because they have a hard time getting some records from some labels.

G-93 is a contemporary hit radio station and their most requested group is The Doors. But many people complain about too many commercials. G-93 would like to know what their listeners think - do you like the request hour? Do you like the top 14, and would you rather hear one song, then 2 or 3 commercials, or 3-5 records, then 6 commercials?
