For someone with the munchies, there was fry bread, either filled with fruit, plain, or taco style.

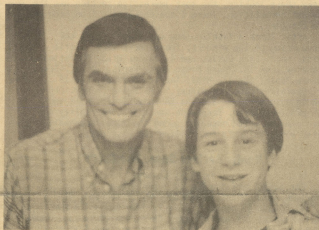
The Indian Days exhibit is fun, interesting and educational. I recommend it for all.

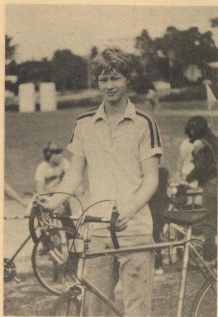

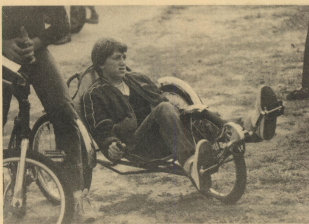

Altogether, the 34 kids brought in \$2514.10! All to help other kids at St. Jude's.

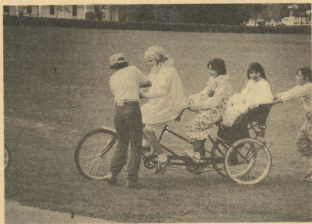
There will be a formal awards presentation of T-shirts and tote bags and other awards. The date has not yet been set, but riders will be notified.

Saturday morning: room service breakfast and off to the studio - and getting nervous. We waited in a big room with other guests and audience members for about 2 hours. Finally Jane Biebert took us aside and explained that we would sit in the audience till Peter Marshall came to us. Then we stand in the aisle while he asks us questions about Kids News.

Then Jane took us through the backstage area to our seats in the audience. A warm-up man (the producer) came out and explained how he wanted everyone to be real excited and JUMP out of your seat if your name was called. There were spotlights of all kinds all over the ceiling so no matter where the host and hostess (Leslie Uggams) were, there would be a spotlight trained on them.

After we signed the release we had to go back to our seats because they taped half of another days show. Very confusing. They tape the other half of the second show on another day with another audience!

After the show we took the scenic route to the hotel and saw the Chinese Theater with the star's names in the sidewalk. Hollywood spelled out on the side of the hill, some real punk rockers with purple hair, etc.

At the hotel, we had room service and collapsed. Then we had a room service snack before going to bed. Sunday morning we had room service breakfast and an hour later went down to the dining room for brunch.

No movie stars at the airport on the trip back. Watched Star Trek: The Wrath of Khan again. Got stranded at the Atlanta airport for several hours due to rain and fog. Home about 2:00 a.m.

It was a fabulous trip and I want to thank my Grandmother for her fantasy, and thank Fantasy for making it all happen. The show will be broadcast December 14 at 3:00 on NBC.

My mom and dad hate video games. They say I can't play them 'cause I'm lazy.

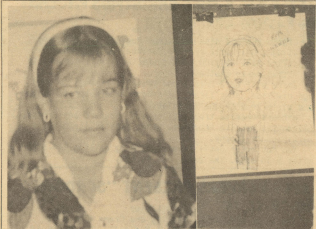
But when I sneak out and go to the arcade, I go "video crazy!"

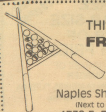
