SUNBURN

AMERICA STILL FREE IN '83

In 1776 the writers of the Declaration of Independence said in the Preamble, "We hold these truths to be self evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.

The early Americans claimed to believe in equal rights and freedom for all but blacks, Indians, women, nonproperty owners, handicapped and other groups. They have not always been allowed to vote, nor given equal rights and treatment. Getting equal rights for these groups has taken a long time and has proven that democracy is a gradual, growing thing that requires all of us to work for equality without the race, color, religion or political ideas mattering. In 1963 we Americans still need to make certain that "we the people" means all the people.

On the national level the debate over the passing of the 27th Amendment, called the Equal Rights Amendment, is a good example of a current freedom project. This Amendment tries to do away with all inequalities in pay and provides freedom in job opportunities.

On the state level the 1976 Bill of Rights for Retarded Persons is an example of laws that try to obtain freedom for a group wherever someones denied it in the past.

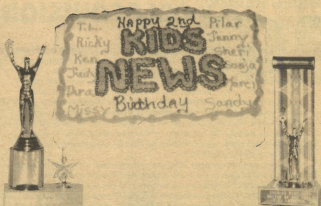
Right here in Collier County we have many problems that require us to decide what freedom really means. One problem that is important right now is the fencing of State Road 84. This fencing will cause some people great difficulty in getting to their land. The citizens must decide if it is right to force these people to use alternative roads in order to protect the safety of I-75.

Another local problem has been the fight about teaching sex education in our schools. Some parents who object to their children receiving these classes want them removed from the school so other children can't have them either. Right now, a special committee has been appointed to study the problem and suggest solutions. They will have to decide what freedom really means in this case.

These few examples should show you that on the national, state and local levels our fight for freedom is an ongoing battle requiring decisions made by all the citizens by voting, writing letters, attending meetings, signing petitions, joining protests and serving on committees.

I am proud to be a Boy Scout because their purpose is to train citizens responsible to themselves, their community and their God. Most of the things I used to write this were taken from the materials I had to gather for the requirements of my Citizenship in the Nation Merit Badge. Whether you are lucky enough to get help from an organization like this or not, you must all become active and concerned citizens to keep America free in '83 and always.
