Just then they announced the winner — number 2 — and Janet won in her age group!

They are the only sisters ever to win a national pageant, and they were the youngest in their age groups in the Miss Charm pageant. Their duties include touring for Miss Charm for the next year; they will interview with a top N.Y. modeling agency; they each received 6 foot high trophies and real fox fur coats. At the end of their reign they will each receive a \$2,000 bond! According to the rules of the Miss Charm pageant, neither of the girls are allowed to enter any more pageants until their year is up. (Last year Janet won the Naples Shrine Club pageant, and she will pass on the title to a new winner on August 20 at Barron Collier High.)

Joyce will be a freshman at Lely High this year, and Janet begins Edison Community College. (For all you loyal Kids News readers, you may remember Janet on the cover of the May '82 issue.)
