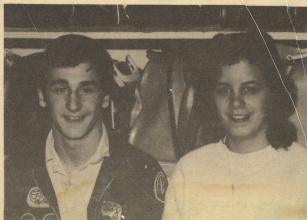
The chimps don't stay with Mr. Illing at night. Both of the chimps are white faced and come from West Africa. Jay-Jay likes grapes the most. Both of them eat about a loaf of bread a day. They eat about anything a person would. Their life span is about 50-60 years. They will get no taller than 5 feet and weigh about 200 pounds. Each one costs about \$10,000 as babies!


