It sounds like a great deal, but it isn't considering that their regular club price is around \$10-\$11. The local record store price is \$7-\$8. Even other merchandise in their "club catalog" starts off cheap (average \$6), but after tax, shipping, etc., it winds up at least \$9. I have 4 more tapes to go, and there is no end in sight. I get an order form every month and I always send it back with no purchase. It is a big bother, and I find in the long run that all the money I've spent on other pur makes up for the money I saved on the membership purchase. I wish I never joined.
